# HOME-SCHOOL AGREEMENT 2015-16

## HOME-SCHOOL AGREEMENT:

A child's education starts at home and continues as a partnership between home and school. To provide maximum opportunities for success, each of the partners should be clear about the responsibilities of the other partners. Our Home-School Agreement seeks to formalise these responsibilities.

## HOME RESPONSIBILITIES:

- ✓ To ensure my child's regular attendance and a high standard of punctuality. Children should be in school by 8.45a.m.
- ✓ To inform the school by 9.30a.m when my child is absent.
- ✓ To inform the school if someone else is collecting my child.
- ✓ To ensure that my child arrives at school appropriately dressed and correctly equipped for the school day including an appropriate PE kit.
- ✓ To make any request for pupil absence using the appropriate form with as much notice as possible and in line with the school's Attendance Policy.
- ✓ To support my child's learning and to ensure that set homework is completed on time, unless alternative arrangements are made with the teacher.
- ✓ To read and sign home link books, which contain weekly notes, on a regular basis, alongside keeping up to date with events through the school website and newsletter.
- ✓ To provide an appropriate environment for homework, to hear my child read and to share texts with my child on a regular basis.
- ✓ To support the school's Behaviour Policy and promote positive behaviour.
- ✓ To attend parent consultation evenings.
- ✓ To inform the school about any concerns about my child's progress, health and happiness including any change in home circumstances.
- ✓ To ensure that my child starts the day with a good breakfast.
- ✓ To behave in an appropriate manner at all times when on and around school property.
- ✓ To be respectful of other people's privacy by only placing comments and pictures of my own child / children on social media sites.
- ✓ To raise any complaints or concerns only via the correct channels.

## SCHOOL RESPONSIBILITIES:

- ✓ To provide a broad and balanced curriculum in a positive and safe learning environment that will help to enable each child to achieve their full potential.
- ✓ To encourage children to question and involve themselves in their educational progress.
- ✓ To provide challenging tasks which foster our 'no limits to learning' approach.
- ✓ To encourage children to work and play co-operatively, valuing the contributions and rights of each individual.
- ✓ To define clear expectations of pupils for behaviour and discipline.
- ✓ To inform parents at an early stage of any concerns that we may have so that parents can discuss and become involved in any matter relating to their child.
- ✓ To care for the academic and social development of each child.
- ✓ To provide clear information to parents through the school prospectus, newsletters, curriculum booklets, specific letters and notices, the school website and written reports.
- ✓ To ensure that parents are given the opportunity to discuss their child's progress or concerns with members of staff at an appropriate time.
- ✓ To make sure instructions for their child's homework are clear.
- ✓ To be open and welcoming and offer parents opportunities to exchange information, ask questions, express views and be involved in the life of the school.
- ✓ To promote a healthy lifestyle and choices for children.
- ✓ To safeguard and promote the welfare of children in all aspects of the school's work.
- ✓ To promote the fundamental British values of democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty and mutual respect for and tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs and for those without faith.
