



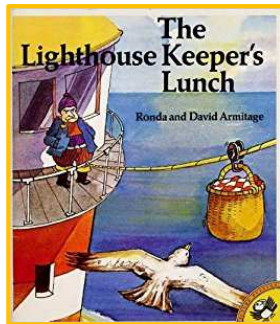

Another busy half-term for Owls Class!

Our literacy has been based around *The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch*. We have really enjoyed reading this book and have learnt lots of new vocabulary. We have also enjoyed coming up with our own ideas to write a story.



We have taken our learning outside and started looking at what we could grow to make our own lighthouse keeper's lunch.

So far, we have planted a variety of herbs including: rosemary, parsley, chives, basil and coriander. We've been looking after them and watching them grow. Next, we will look at different recipes that we could use to make some tasty snacks using these herbs.



Sir Francis Drake has been the focus of our topic. We've talked about who he was and what he did. We had a go at drawing portraits of him and exploring his voyage. We used maps to see where he travelled, and atlases to identify the different oceans and continents.



In science we have continued to explore the adaptations of different arctic animals. We have learnt what helps them to survive in the harsh conditions.



In maths we have been exploring multiplication and division. We have used arrays to help us. We thought about where we would find an array in real life. Here are some examples:

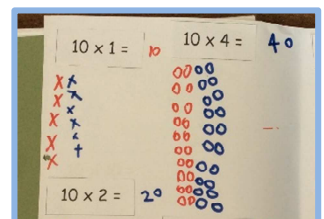


2×3 or 3×2
