
Welcome to the Rainbow Room class page.


In literacy lessons, the Key Stage One children have been reading stories about a character called Oliver who dislikes vegetables and fruit. Key Stage Two children have been working hard on improving their story writing skills, they have also learnt how to write play scripts.

All children have continued to enjoy the many sensory experiences – an integral part of their learning - including making fruit animals and trying new and exotic fruits.



We have all enjoyed playing games and taking part in the many sensory activities in the CAIRB. We all love blowing bubbles, rolling and bouncing on the gym ball. All CAIRB children have enjoyed taking part in the different class trips. They have been to Charmouth, Dartmoor Zoo, as well as, shopping at Endsleigh, visiting Ivybridge and the local shops and the library.

Our art sessions have been based around the topic of animals; the children have made some great camouflage pictures, as well as using paper plates to create ladybirds and butterflies for our class display.



In maths the Key Stage One children have been learning about addition and subtraction. Key Stage Two children have been working on percentages and fractions. They have also worked extremely hard at learning their times tables.

Everyone has enjoyed our social skills sessions, working on different areas of this subject. This has included Key Stage One children practising turn taking and giving eye contact to others, and Key Stage Two learning about conflict and resolution in friendships. Many children have also been preparing for transition to their new schools in September. They have made passports for their new class teachers, visited their new schools and made transition books.



Some of the younger children have been visiting the donkey sanctuary to take part in their Education programme.

They have learnt how to give the donkeys commands and how to groom and handle them.
